I. Call to Order and Introductions.

Wilson called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm.

II. Approval of Minutes for December 10, 2025.

A motion to approve the minutes for December 10, 2025, was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.

III. President's Update.

Wilson had a phone conversation with Brian Soady, SUAA Executive Director. Carr told Wilson that we have 262 members for whom we don't have email addresses. Soady said that if we sent him this list he would use AI techniques to find as many of the email addresses as possible. The consensus was to wait until we sent out the postcard to these members requesting their email address before handing the list off to Soady.

Wilson also asked Soady if the SUAA-UIUC chapter would have any specific "co-hosting" duties for the June State SUAA meeting taking place in Champaign-Urbana. Soady wants SUAA-UIUC to share these duties with the Parkland SUAA, so Soady plans to go over the plans during a Zoom call with Wilson and a Parkland representative.

IV. Treasurer's Report

Loots presented the report for the activity in January 2026 and the year to date. Loots was thanked for the report.

Loots is still working with UIUC HR regarding payment to the graphics designer's various projects. A UIUC HR C-FOAPL account number is used to pay these invoices, but there isn't a process to get the relevant data to Loots so she can reimburse HR. Loots proposed a procedure for payment of Campus services, **attached**. This proposal allows Loots to take the initiative and write IHR and tell them we plan to reimburse the charges. We do have one charge where the designer was not able to provide a copy of the invoice because the invoice was in an old system. Mainz has provided confirmation that the service was delivered. The recommendation was that Loots should wait for Uchtmann to agree with making the discussed payment so it doesn't provoke an audit process. A proposal to approve the draft procedure was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.

V. Action/Discussion Items.

- A. 2026 Annual Meeting Planning. McCall was successful in obtaining Kam Cox, UIUC Associate Athletic Director for Business Operations, to speak on the history of NIL, pros/cons, etc. He is available Sunday April 19, so arrangements have been made to have the 2026 Annual meeting on that date. McCall has secured the Quad Room at the I-Hotel and made similar arrangements as for other previous Annual Meetings. She plans to ask the State office to send out a "save the date" email at least a month ahead, then reminders 2 weeks ahead, 1 week ahead, and the week of the meeting. She will also send announcement to Ross for posting to facebook and Mainz for posting to the website.
- B. Nominating Committee Report for 2026-2029 candidates for the Executive Committee. As background for the report, Williamson circulated a document summarizing the membership of the Executive Committee since 1992 (**attached**). The Nominating Committee of Loots (Chair), Gallagher, Ross, and Williamson proposed the following slate of candidates for 2026-2029 terms on the Executive Committee: Melinda Carr, Tanya Gallagher, Vera Mainz, and H. F. Williamson. The proposed slate was approved unanimously.

- C. Report on *Annuitant*. Discuss options going forward. Communications Committee chair submitted a report on the issues, **attached**. The report recommends sending a postcard to members without email addresses. The proposed content for the postcard was edited and approved. Mainz will order pre-stamped postcards from the USPS, print the postcards, use her address for the return address (she has a self-inking return address stamp), attach the address labels and mail.

The Spring *Annuitant* should include the nomination information. Williamson noted that all of the candidates should have statements on record in previous *Annuitants*. There was a consensus that there would be no more printed issues of the *Annuitant*. Carr will act as editor for the Spring 2026 issue and will oversee a format change to a more condensed, digital format. The report included recommendations for what needs to be included in the Spring 2026 issue. These recommendations were assigned as needed and content was requested to be sent to Carr by Feb. 28th. It was suggested that Loudermilk could set up the new digital format template but Carr thought she could take care of this.

- D. Planning for State Conference and Business Meeting. Wilson noted that our involvement doesn't seem to be as large as it might be. Wilson doesn't believe we will need to do more than present options for venues for a reception outside of the I-Hotel. The State SUAA might need some help staffing the check-in and registration table. We won't need to set up tours, speakers, etc.
- E. Review Records Retention Guidelines. The first step will be for the review group (Loots, Mainz, and Williamson) to set up a date to meet and start the evaluation of our old records.

- D. Benefits Committee: Hirschi, Ross, Stone (Chair), Williamson. No report.

3. The service is requested.
 - A. The C-FOAPL is provided to the unit providing the services.
 - B. The unit is asked to copy the SUAA Chapter Treasurer when invoicing the IHR C-FOAPL.
4. The Treasurer receives a copy of the invoice and verifies that the services were provided.
5. The Treasurer transmits a reimbursement for the charge to the business officer in IHR.

SUAA-UIUC Executive Committee: Communications Committee Report – February 11, 2026

The Communications Committee is listed along with the newsletter and website on the Executive Committee Agenda, so there is overlap with the roles and responsibilities. We need more volunteers for this committee. I met with Tanya Gallagher and Vera Mainz joined the Zoom call briefly on February 6 at 2 p.m. and I also briefly talked with Bill Williamson. I have been involved primarily with The Annuitant during and following Carol Livingstone's passing away, serving as co-editor and then interim editor. I had planned to step away while training someone else and working in the background. I still may need to step away later, depending on my current personal situation and I will let the President know. I will continue working in consultation with the Executive Committee (not as editor) but functioning as an "Editorial Board" with contributing writers from the various standing committees.

Proposed Content for Post Card in Preparation for 2026 Spring Meeting

Note: We normally print 2,100 copies for the Spring Annuitant which covers all members (with and without emails) and campus administrators (nonmembers). Only current members (estimated 1069) with emails (minus campus administrators) received the Fall 2025 Annuitant through email from the State SUAA office. There are currently 362 members without email as of January 22, 2026. Over half of the 362 members without email live locally in Champaign County. The remaining membership live in other states.

SUAA Member Update/Content For Postcard

This Fall's 2025 Annuitant was distributed to SUAA members by email. All future issues will also be distributed digitally. We do not have your email address so we are sending this note to indicate that you can read it by accessing the SUAA Chapter website at <https://suaa-ui.org/newsletters.htm>. We also wanted to share that the Spring Meeting will be April 19, 2026, 3pm, at the QUAD room at the I-Hotel. Please forward your email address (along with your first and last name) by sending a message to the Secretary, Vera Mainz. Her email address is secretary@suaa-ui.org. We look forward to hearing from you.

Additional Information To Consider: The preprinted return address will be included on the postcard. It will be their responsibility to contact us by mail to confirm they do not have an email address or have access challenges. How do we deal with the digital divide for those who may not have an email address or have other access issues? As we know, the state SUAA office is still mailing out printed materials including renewals & SUAAction. I'm willing to do a small mailing with names of nominees printed from the PDF which will be in line with the current by laws. Some individuals have been members for 30 years! If we change the bylaws, shouldn't we address this part with a grace period to help people during the transition? Please advise for any corrections or misunderstandings to help us move in the right direction.

Annuitant Email History: The Executive Committee has been trying to get emails from members dating back to the Fall Issue of 2010 posted on the website ([The Annuitant Fall 2010.pdf](#)). For those who have emails, they should be held accountable to send it. The bylaws were changed in 2020 during the pandemic to allow for electronic communications (ARTICLE IX, Section 9.2. All communication

required in these bylaws, including meeting notices, may be sent electronically.). We have a small staff handling mass production. A brief survey would be appropriate; but we don't have the time.

Approvals Needed: Asking the Executive Committee to approve the proposed content for postcards, printing and mailing. We also need volunteers. Vera has offered to help with printing, and we'll need to purchase cards, or we would need to get them printed at FEDEX Kinkos.

You can buy stamped postcards on-line at usps.com: https://store.usps.com/store/cards-envelopes/stamped-cards/_/N-ncwfb2 It looks like packs of 10 cost \$6.90 (\$0.69 each), so 250 would cost \$172.50.

PROPOSED OPTIONS FOR PRINT AND HYBRID PROCESS – SPRING/FALL ANNUITANT

1. These are the past introductory production guidelines with reflections and questions. They will need to be updated once the Executive Committee approves a process. Production timeline is tied to the dates for the spring (usually April) and fall (usually October) membership meetings. From the call for articles to delivery in mailboxes is approximately 9-10 weeks. Steps 1-4 are what we normally do for the print version. **[NOTE: DID ANYONE RECEIVE FEEDBACK ABOUT THE EMAILS FROM THE 2025 FALL ANNUITANT? I'M ASSUMING WE'LL ASK STATE SUAA OFFICE TO SEND NOTIFICATION TO THOSE WHO HAVE EMAILS FOR THE SPRING 2026 ANNUITANT. THIS WILL SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCE THE PROCESSING TIME. IF WE HAVE FEEDBACK ABOUT ACCESS OR MAILING FROM THOSE WITHOUT EMAILS, WE CAN ADDRESS IT LATER. THAT DATA WILL BE OUR UNOFFICIAL SURVEY PILOT TEST.]**
2. About 3-4 months out from membership meeting (January and June) create a tentative timeline based on Sunday dates in April/October). This is helpful if anyone on the committee would like to know when articles might be due.
3. **As soon as the membership meeting date is confirmed, generate a final timeline and let the committee know when articles will be due.**
4. Make notes about potential articles from discussions at EC meetings about article suggestions or as ideas occur. **AFTER REVIEWING THE PROPOSED SCHEDULE & ARTICLES BELOW, WE CAN DISCUSS OTHER IDEAS.**

PAST PRINT PUBLICATION PROCESS--Spring issue (approx. 2,100 copies) – This issue is mailed to chapter membership and campus administrators. Elections to the Executive Committee are held at the spring meeting and, per our bylaws, this issue must be in member mailboxes 15 days prior to the spring meeting date. NOTE: Because of the elections, the EC must begin to establish a slate of candidates with sufficient time for you to receive bios for all candidates prior to your article deadline.

PAST PRINT PUBLICATION PROCESS--Fall issue (approx. 11,700) – Because this issue also includes the CCFD insert for the Campus Charitable Fund Drive, it is mailed to chapter membership (current employees only), to all UIUC annuitants (via blind mail service through SURS) and campus administrators. Because this issue goes to all UIUC annuitants, labels are provided by SURS directly to the Mailing Center. Final copy must be approved by the SUAA Executive Director prior to being put into print production (**see PDF file of Blind Mailing Policy**). Changes cannot be made after we receive SURS approval. [MELINDA'S NOTE: Campus Charitable Fund Drive (CCFD), FIRST FALL INSERT SEPT. 1, 2013. ARE WE KEEPING THIS INSERT AS PART OF THE ANNUITANT WEBSITE POSTING AND WORKING WITH THE CAMPUS OFFICE? NOTE: We are losing our largest audience through the fall Annuitant mailing of 11,000 plus, but we still have lots of room for growth because our membership does not match the distribution. This audience is mostly available through print mailings, so we will need to find another way to correspond with these individuals. If a mass mailing is needed for critical updates, another option is to consult with SUAA state office to get approval from SURS. The state office is already working with SURS, so they may already be discussing future opportunities for outreach.
